Earlsdon Leads the Way!

A scheme set up by the churches of Earlsdon and Chapelfields to help isolated older people has gained city-wide recognition, and the council is now funding its replication across other parts of the city.

Nine months ago, St Barbara's Church, working alongside the other four main Methodist, Baptist, Roman Catholic and Anglican churches in the community, funded the appointment of a Good Neighbours Project co-ordinator, Jessica Moore, for this area. Through Jessica's work, many volunteer befrienders have been recruited. They visit an older person who would benefit from com-

panionship and conversation on a weekly basis. Indeed, across the city, there are now over 250 older people receiving a regular visit.

Coventry City Council have been so impressed with the scheme that they have agreed to fund the co-ordinator post for the next year, and fund two more co-ordinator posts in the north of the city.

There are still important ways in which we as a community can support the scheme.

If you know of an older person who struggles to get

out, or is feeling lonely, then please talk to them about the opportunity of a befriender coming to visit them. All volunteers are DBS police checked and receive training, and there is a careful matching and

introduction process, managed by Jessica. Jessica is very happy to meet to chat through how the scheme works before any commitment need be made.

And if you would like to become a volunteer, popping in to visit someone for a weekly chat, then Good Neighbours would love to hear from you too.

Thought for the Month: More than a Piece of Paper

In January, over 70 people struggled through the snow and wind to come and sign a piece of paper at St Barbara's church.

Indeed, it was more than a piece of paper; it was five; but it was more than that in another way too.

The pieces of paper being signed were a "covenant", an agreement, that committed us as members of the local churches to work with each other, to support each other, and to pray and worship together.

The church hasn't always

been great at unity. Down through the centuries there have been splits and divisions, schisms and disagreements. But here in Earlsdon and Chapelfields, we are trying to change that. The five main churches in this community – Earlsdon Methodist, Hearsall Baptist, All Souls Roman Catholic, St Mary Magdalene, and St Barbara's – meet regularly to pray and worship. We do so through our monthly prayer breakfasts, our Prayers and Bears toddler service, and our united services.

But we also meet to serve our community together. The Good Neighbours Scheme is a good example. We also work together to support organisations

> like Carriers of Hope, who work amongst refugees in the city. And we meet regularly with the local mosque, to build friendship and understanding.

The Mogan family have been coming more regularly to St Barbara's church for about 4 years, since their twin girls went to the preschool, and they love it here. Alice said she likes learning about God and Hattie likes seeing her friends here. Their dad, Michael, agrees that everyone is very friendly at St Barbara's and it's like one big happy family. Mum, Karen, adds "I'm surprised that more people don't come because they'd like it. They might not realise how welcoming it is and children can feel at home there". Michael points out that it's not stuffy, and Karen that it can be all things to all people, with many options of different services to go to. Alice and Hattie's favourite service is Buzz at St



B's, whereas Michael and Karen's is the Christmas Eve service where all the children get to dress up. They also appreciate how St Barbara's gets involved in things such as Toilet Twinning and helping refugees and homeless people, providing the opportunity for children to learn about these causes and demonstrating how Christianity should answer the call of those in need.

Outside of St Barbara's Hattie enjoys school and Alice likes making things and going to the park. They all enjoy swimming and the girls have fun at Rainbows, which also meets at St Barbara's.

Join us for Easter

At the end of the month, millions of people all over the world will stop to remember and celebrate the central events of the Christian faith. Do come and join us for some of our services over this very special time.

Buzz at St B's Easter Special (25th March; 5pm-5.45pm) – join us as we literally walk through the Easter story, going to different parts of the church and garden to imagine and re-live the events of Easter, through drama and music. It is a wonderfully special way to introduce children to the Easter story. We finish with sandwiches, cakes and tea.

Maundy Thursday Communion

Service (29th March; 7.30pm) – an intimate and beautiful service as we share communion and reflect on the events of the Last Supper through music and words.

Good Friday Workshops (30th March; 1-2pm) – join us to explore the significance of Good Friday through a range of craft and reflective activities for children and young families.

Good Friday Service of the Cross (30th March; 2-3pm) – a guiet and moving service as we remember afresh the suffering and death of Christ.

Easter Sunrise Service (1st April; 5.30am) – an unforgettable way to start Easter with a bonfire, candles and the welcoming of the dawn, and with a hearty breakfast for all afterwards. The service, which mixes ancient liturgy, inspiring readings, visual wonder and joyful celebration, is for many, children and adults alike, the most memorable service of the year. (Note that this replaces our usual 8am service).

Easter Sunday Service (1st April; 10am) – a wonderful, uplifting

service as we celebrate the resurrection of Christ and the new life he brings, followed by an Easter bonnet parade.

11th March is Mothering Sunday. What plans have you made? What plans are being made for you?

It is a special day when we can give thanks for our mothers, and recognize and value their unique contribution in our lives.

Why not come and make St Barbara's part of your plans. Our Mothering Sunday service is at 10am - late enough to do that special breakfast in bed beforehand; and will be finished by 11am - so plenty of time to cook that special Sunday lunch afterwards!
