Call to Prayer for Britain and Europe: The Bishop of Coventry writes:

"...the question before us in these days of great political uncertainly [is] to identify, consider and love our neighbours, all of our neighbours. As we seek to do that in prayer, and in other ways, I encourage you, therefore, to pray not only for our British neighbours but also for our European neighbours and for our world neighbours.

"On every side of the debate, attention has been on what is best for us, for our nation. In prayer especially, but also in every way of acting, we are called to put that which is good for our neighbour at the centre of our hearts. St Paul summarises the radical Christian ethic when he says, "Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interest of others" (Philippians 2.3).

"It is the challenge of the Church in our times to show how our debates and decisions could be transformed by that reorientation towards what is good for others. For Jesus tells us that we are to love our neighbours as we love ourselves, and that is how we show our love for God."
