Join in our Weekly Lent Challenge: Each time you turn on a tap this week remember Jesus, the living water, the giver of life, and pray for those who have to walk long distances to collect their water from dirty rivers. Save for our Lent Appeal: The local church in Wagete, Uganda, was so inspired by Jesus' example of caring for others, that it brought the whole community together to see what they could do. First, everyone worked together in digging the village's first well. That enabled them to grow vegetables to sell at market, and meant children had time to go to school, rather than having to walk several miles to collect water each day. Through the church's organization and encouragement every household in the village now has a latrine, and a health clinic has been built.

Join a Lent Group: Two ecumenical Lent groups will each hold five meetings during Lent to follow a York course titled *Daring to see God Now*. The Gospel proclaims the "Good News of God" - but what is this 'good news', and who is it for? This course raises important questions about change, repentance, and how we can become living evidence of the good news.

One group will meet on Tuesday afternoons starting at 2pm this Tuesday (12th March) at 94 Earlsdon Avenue South, and the other will meet on Wednesday evenings at 7.30pm from 20th March at Earlsdon Methodist Church.
