## **Minor Redecoration and Renewal**

Around the church there are a variety of (mainly painting jobs) that could be tackled by members of the congregation used to doing their own decorating/odd jobs.

Each job could be done at the convenience of anybody prepared to do it - although doing a job inside the building needs to take account of the users.

Reasonable cost of materials could be reimbursed, if required.

### **Item 1**

Redecoration of the Vestry Entrance, Kitchenette and Toilet. This job could be done in August when the choir will be on holiday and fewer people will be in these areas.

### **Item 2**

Ladies toilet wall on the right as you enter the toilet has a long horizontal crack caused by brickwork problems which have been repaired.

Need to make good the plaster and redecorate the wall,

### **Item 3**

Repaint the cross on the exterior wall to the left of the foyer doors.

### **Item 4**

Repaint the internal window sills on the plain windows in church – one window on the west wall above the children's area and three windows on the North aisle wall; the window frames appear to be in good order and do not need repainting.

### **Item 5**

The two plain west windows both need painting on the outside; one being at low level but the other being above the west door of the church with access via the roof of the foyer.

### **Item 6**

The existing toilet seats in the ladies toilet are visually unsightly and need to be replaced

### **Item 7**

Drainpipe on South wall in the corner created by the South door closest to the foyer door is cracked at eye-level and water has escaped and run down the wall. Inside church there is visible damage to the brickwork at floor level.

### **Item 8**

The fireplace in the vicar's vestry needs to be blocked off but an air brick or equivalent fitted for ventilation and decorated. There is some flaking paint above the safe which looks unsightly.

Can you wield a paintbrush? If so, please think whether you could tackle any of these jobs. Even if you cannot offer immediately, please save this job list in case you can help in future.
