A New Daily Reflection Series: On Monday 9th September, to accompany our sermon series, we will be beginning a new daily reflection series, *Praying the Psalms*. The Psalms are an extraordinary treasure trove of prayers and songs written between 2,500 and 3,000 years ago, that can speak directly into our own experiences today, and have been used as an inspiration for prayer and worship ever since they were written. Over five weeks, we will have the opportunity to read a psalm a day and to reflect upon them and respond to them in prayer. The feedback was outstandingly positive and appreciative. It was a very worthwhile club for us to support.
