Christmas Carol Service this evening (Sunday 22nd December) starts at 6.30pm and is always a beautiful service of carols and readings, led by our excellent choir. Join in singing carols old and new, as we hear and receive the good news set forth in Scripture of the birth of Christ and offer God our thanksgiving in the joyful singing of carols. Join us after the service for fellowship over some refreshments. If you were able to donate a few mince pies, it would further contribute to this festive occasion.

Coventry Winter Night Shelter (CWNS): Last Monday a team from St Barbara's planned and delivered 25 hot two-course meals (including a vegetarian option) to the CWNS at All Souls Church for the guests and volunteers. The meal was very well received, and their culinary skill was appreciated. They plan to prepare food for CWNS on two further evenings in the next fortnight. We are most grateful to each member of the team. **CWNS** looks after up to 20 homeless people each night during the four winter months. Seven church venues each open for one night per week. Guests are provided with the service they need and the dignity they deserve. Rough sleepers are offered support, a hot meal, a safe and warm bed for the night and some breakfast. Homelessness has no nationality, no religion, no colour, no sexuality and does not discriminate on the basis of age. Most of the problem is hidden and the statistics do not reflect where people are struggling to maintain a roof over their heads by perhaps staying with friends, "Sofa-surfing". On average, CWNS assists 60+ guests per year through 380 volunteers who cook for, clothe, support, welcome, befriend and engage in conversation with the guests.
