CTEC Lent Course: Difference – the power of faith in a conflicted world is a 5-session course that explores what it means to follow Jesus in the face of conflict and see transformation through everyday encounters. The course will run at Earlsdon Methodist Church on Wednesday evenings at 7.30pm on the 4th, 11th, 18th and 25th March and the 1st April. The sessions are: 1) God's Call, 2) Crossing Divides, 3) Disagreeing Well, 4) Practicing Forgiveness, and 5) Courage as Community. Difference was born out of Archbishop Justin Welby's vision that the church should be a reconciling presence in the midst of conflict.

#LiveLent 2020 – Care for God's Creation: Thousands of people will take action to help tackle Climate Change as part of the Church of England's first ever official green Lent campaign. For those wishing to go deeper #LiveLent 2020 is based on the Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book, Saying Yes to Life, by Dr Ruth Valerio, Global Influencing and Advocacy Director at Tearfund. Instead of giving up chocolate or alcohol for Lent, participants are challenged to follow a set of daily reflections, which correspond to chapters of the full Lent book for those wishing to go deeper. With children's, youth and family resources also available, there is something to help every age group to get involved. "How much water goes into making a pair of Jeans?" "Could you twin your toilet?" "When was the last time you gazed at the night sky?" and "What was the carbon footprint of the meal I just ate?" – these are just some of the questions and topics participants will explore, with a different challenge every day.
