A prayer of preparation:

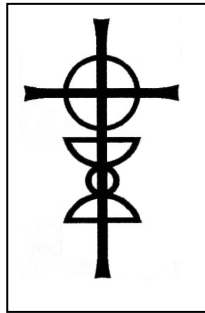
God of our days and years,

The gospel calls us to turn away from sin
and be faithful to Christ.



As we offer ourselves to him in penitence and faith,
we renew our confidence and trust in his mercy.

Let us return to the Lord our God and say to him:

**God our Father,
long-suffering, full of grace and truth,
you create us from nothing and give us life.
You give your faithful people new life in the water
of baptism.**

**You do not turn your face from us,
nor cast us aside.**

**We confess that we have sinned
against you and our neighbour.**

**We have wounded your love and marred
your image in us.**

**Restore us for the sake of your Son,
and bring us to heavenly joy,
in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

The absolution:

May the Father of all mercies
cleanse *us* from *our* sins,
and restore *us* in his image
to the praise and glory of his name,
through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

*We remain **standing** for the collect, the church's special prayer for today:*

Almighty God,
who wonderfully created us in your own image
and yet more wonderfully restored us
through your Son Jesus Christ:
grant that, as he came to share in our humanity,
so we may share the life of his divinity;
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

At the end: This is the Word of the Lord

Thanks be to God

*We **stand** for our second hymn*

*We remain **standing** for our Gospel reading*

The reading is announced: Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

Glory to you, O Lord

At the end of the reading: This is the Gospel of Christ

Praise to you, O Christ

*We **sit** for the sermon*

*After a moment of reflection following the sermon, we **stand** for the affirmation of faith*

Let us declare our faith in God.

We believe in God the Father,

from whom every family

in heaven and on earth is named.

We believe in God the Son,

who lives in our hearts through faith,

and fills us with his love.

We believe in God the Holy Spirit,

who strengthens us

with power from on high.

We believe in one God;

Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

*We **sit or kneel** for our prayers of intercession*

accept these prayers

The Lord's Prayer

Let us pray for the coming of God's kingdom

in the words our Saviour taught us.

Our Father in heaven,

hallowed be your name,

your kingdom come,

your will be done,

on earth as in heaven.

Give us today our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins

as we forgive those who sin against us.

Lead us not into temptation

but deliver us from evil.

For the kingdom, the power,

and the glory are yours

now and for ever. Amen.

God made a covenant with the people of Israel, calling them

to

be a holy nation, chosen to bear witness to God's steadfast

love

by finding delight in the law.

The covenant was renewed in Jesus Christ our Lord, in his life, work, death and resurrection. In him all people may be set free from sin and its power, and united in love and obedience.

In this covenant God promises us new life in Christ. For our part we promise to live no longer for ourselves but for God.

We meet, therefore, as generations have met before us, to renew the covenant which bound them and binds us to God.

This means that, by the help of the Holy Spirit, we accept God's purpose for us, and the call to love and serve God in all our life and work.

So let us make this covenant of God our own. Let us give ourselves to God, trust in his promises and rely on his grace.

I am no longer my own but yours.

Your will, not mine, be done in all things,

wherever you may place me, in all that I do

**and in all that I may endure;
when there is work for me and when there is none;
when I am troubled and when I am at peace.
Your will be done when I am valued and when I am
disregarded;
when I find fulfilment and when it is lacking;
when I have all things, and when I have nothing.
I willingly offer all I have and am to serve you, as and
where you choose.**

**Glorious and blessed God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit,
you are mine and I am yours. May it be so for ever. Let
this covenant now made on earth be fulfilled in heaven.
Amen.**
