Thought for the Season: More than bricks and mortar



This summer I was fortunate to visit a number of European cities. Some places left me open-mouthed in awe or in surprise.

In Rome, I walked into the ancient Senate House in the Roman forum, two thousand years old, and one could almost touch the history of the place, as we stood in the place where Roman emperors and senators would debate. In Amsterdam, on a cycling tour of the city, I was taken completely by surprise when we turned a corner and cycled through the centre of the famous Rijksmuseum, the wonderful art galleries on view through the windows on either side of us.

Places do indeed have the power to move us, their histories to shape us. This month, we celebrate that the St Barbara's church building was dedicated 93 years ago. As churches go, it is not a particularly old building, but even in its short life-time it has witnessed many life-changing events. It

has witnessed over a thousand baptisms - each one a celebration of the gift of new life and a commitment to following in the ways of Christ. It has witnessed hundreds of weddings and blessings, the celebration of love and commitment of two people to each other. It has witnessed hundreds of funerals too, the place of grief and consolation, of sadness and hope. And it has witnessed in the region of 150,000 services(!), each one offering prayer and worship, thanksgiving and supplication.

No wonder it is a special place, a place where many find peace and joy. But, as important as it is, the building is not nearly as important as the people who are part of it. The church is first and foremost not a building but a people—a people bound together by love for God, each other and the world around them, a people committed to enabling all to experience life in all its fullness.

As I returned from a holiday seeing some remarkable places, I was reminded afresh that the greatest joy is in the people around us. Do come and enjoy our special building, and do come and be part of this community of faith too - you will be very welcome.
