Burundi: As the Community of the Cross of Nails begins to lead their course in reconciliation, we have received very bad news from Burundi. The economy is crumbling, sparked by the political crisis, and food prices have rocketed, leading to staggering levels of hunger. The US Agency for International Development reports that across the country, one in every six children under five years of age is now suffering from chronic malnutrition. Over half the deaths of children under five years are from preventable and treatable conditions - like malnutrition or diarrhoea. The situation is critical. Relief agencies, such as Tearfund, are working to bring help to vulnerable people in Burundi and in neighbouring Rwanda.
