The Quiet Garden Movement nurtures access to outdoor space for prayer and reflection in a variety of settings, such as private homes, churches, retreat centres, schools and hospitals – and creates opportunities for people to experience silence, restfulness and contemplative practices, with regular quiet days and retreats being offered in many Quiet Gardens. The Quiet Garden Movement has 200 Gardens, including Charlecote Quiet Garden, and Breathing Space at Allesley. Quiet Gardens vary widely in their size and situation, but at the core is the provision of outdoor space intentionally set aside for prayer, silence and refreshment. This can be a permanent space, such as in a church, retreat centre or school setting, or a provisional space set aside for a particular time, such as the use of gardens in private homes. A key feature is setting aside a sanctuary space and time for stillness, prayer and contemplation. Quiet Gardens are enjoyed in solitude and with others, with some gardens being open as part of regular 'quiet days' and retreats and others by appointment only.
