Carriers of Hope: Many thanks to everyone for your continued support. You may be interested to read (below) the report written by the charity's founder of the work undertaken last year:

"During 2019, 245 new families enrolled as members, coming from 39 different countries. This is our biggest number of new families in a twelve-month period, ever, so the need isn't reducing - and this was on top of our existing members. In 2019 the number of new families who made their way to us for help averaged out at 7 per week, with the highest numbers of new families coming from Syria, Nigeria, Somalia, Sudan and Romania. This is in addition to the regulars and returners. We are helping well over 150 families every week. All of the new families receive a home visit to enable us to assess those in the greatest need. Donors-of-the-week take a turn once a year to provide some of the essential items that we give away each week. Things like dry food items, nappies, toiletries, cleaning products, potatoes, onions, rice and tinned tomatoes." Sue Sampson
