
A Service of the Word

The greeting:

A prayer of preparation: Let us pray. Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful people, and kindle in us the fire of your love; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

We stand for our opening hymn

We sit or kneel for our confession:



Let us return to the Lord our God and say to him: Father, we have sinned against heaven and against you. We are not worthy to be called your children. We turn to you again. Have mercy on us, bring us back to yourself as those who once were dead but now have life through Christ our Lord. Amen. *The absolution:*

May the Father of all mercies cleanse *us* from *our* sins, and restore *us* in his image to the praise and glory of his name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

We stand to declare our praise: Now that we have been put right with God through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. He has brought us by faith into the grace of God. We rejoice in the hope of sharing God's glory. This hope does not deceive us:

God has poured his love into our hearts by the gift of his Spirit.

We remain **standing** for an act of praise based on Psalm 145:

Great is the Lord and greatly to be praised:

there is no end to his greatness.

One generation shall praise your works to another,

and shall declare your power.

All creation praises you, Lord,

and your faithful servants bless you.

They declare the glory of your kingdom and tell of your mighty power. My mouth shall proclaim the praise of the Lord.

Let every living thing bless his holy name for ever and ever.

We remain **standing** for the collect, the church's special prayer for today:

Almighty God, you have broken the tyranny of sin and have sent the Spirit of your Son into our hearts whereby we call you Father: give us grace to dedicate our freedom to your service, that we and all creation may be brought to the glorious liberty of the children of God; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

We sit for our Bible reading

At the end: This is the Word of the Lord **Thanks be to God**

We stand for our second hymn

We remain standing for our Gospel reading

The reading is announced:

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke Glory to you, O Lord

At the end of the reading: This is the Gospel of Christ **Praise to you, O Christ**

We sit for the sermon

After a moment of reflection following the sermon, we **stand** for the affirmation of faith:

Let us declare our faith in God. We believe in God the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named. We believe in God the Son, who lives in our hearts through faith, and fills us with his love. We believe in God the Holy Spirit, who strengthens us with power from on high. We believe in one God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

We remain **standing** for our offertory hymn

We sit or kneel for our prayers of intercession

Our response may be: ...Lord, in your mercy **Hear our prayer**

At the conclusion of our prayers, we pray: Merciful Father,

accept these prayers for the sake of your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Lord's Prayer:

Let us pray for the coming of God's kingdom in the words our Saviour taught us.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,

your kingdom come,

your will be done,

on earth as in heaven.

Give us today our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins

as we forgive those who sin against us.

Lead us not into temptation

but deliver us from evil.

For the kingdom, the power,

and the glory are yours

now and for ever. Amen.

We stand for a prayer of blessing:

May God the Father, Judge all-merciful, make us worthy of a place in his kingdom. **Amen.** May God the Son, coming among us in power, reveal in our midst the promise of his glory. **Amen.** May God the Holy Spirit make us steadfast in faith, joyful in hope and constant in love.**Amen.** And the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always. **Amen.**

We remain **standing** for our closing hymn

A closing prayer:

The Lord God almighty is our Father: he loves us and tenderly cares for us. The Lord Jesus Christ is our Saviour: he has redeemed us and will defend us to the end. The Lord, the Holy Spirit, is among us: he will lead us in God's holy way. To God almighty, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, be praise and glory today and for ever. Amen. The sending out:

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord. In the name of Christ. Amen.
